

RI PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

February 2023

Recently, I spent time in the Nakivale refugee settlement in Uganda. As the "settlement" in its name suggests, the people living there are free to move around and integrate as best they can — one thing that makes the place unique.

I had a chance to play soccer with boys and girls from about a dozen nations and talk with women who had fled areas of conflict. It was a tapestry of human experience shared through both laughter and tears.

As I walked across a school campus at the settlement with a teacher, she shared with me the dire statistics on girls' education. Most don't get through grade school. Many are sold into child marriage to pay for food for their families. As I looked around at these young girls, I was gutted.

> We can do more to empower girls and women, and we can expand how we share the progress Rotary members and our partners have made toward this goal.

There is no shortage of inspiring examples of our work, from interest-free microcredit loans for women in Nigeria, to projects in India that provide girls menstrual hygiene products. Hundreds of projects are taking place across all Rotary areas of focus and are making a meaningful and often lifesaving difference.

Together, we can address the needs and inequities that girls throughout the world face daily. But we must also monitor the impact of



these projects and create awareness of Rotary resources and subject matter experts, including Rotary Action Groups, The Rotary Foundation Cadre of Technical Advisers, Rotary Peace Fellows, and others.

It is especially important that we tell the stories of our initiatives that have a positive impact on the lives of women and girls. This last point is near and dear to my heart. This means sharing our stories on social media, through local news outlets, in this magazine, and wherever we can inspire others.

As you do so, it's important to provide information that helps our Rotary family connect with others who are implementing activities in their regions, as well as across the world. Let's share our successes and learn from one another — then proudly tell our stories to a larger audience.

These are exciting times in Rotary, and the world is taking notice. As we work to empower women and girls to step into their full potential, we create new pathways for membership growth and greater collaboration with partners to create positive, lasting change. Thank you for your continued action in this vital effort.





The 31st Staging of PALAROTARY

After a two-year break from a 30-year unbroken annual staging, the traditional Palarotary was held at the Marikina Sports Center, Marikina City, last February 5, 2023, Sunday. It was the 31st staging of the annual sports event of Rotary International District (RID) 3800 hosted by the Rotary Club of Rivercity Marikina and the Rotary Club of Mandaluyong Premier under the theme "Remembering the 1st Thirty Years and Celebrating a New Beginning".

The event established ground-breaking FIRSTS, justifying the host clubs' mission: to make Palarotary's new beginning memorable, and enjoyable in all ways possible to generate more awareness, interest, support, and participation by Rotarians and their families for the future Palarotarys.



Among the many FIRSTS in that event are the following:

- Most Attended close to 1,000 (933) individuals composed of Rotarians, their families, Rotaractors, Interactors, and friends in Rotary were present, either as game/s participants, supporters, or just spectators;

- Club Listing a total of 88 out of 107 clubs joined and participated in the event;
- 4) Symbolic Passing of the Torch Ceremony seven (7) PDGs re-enacted a symbolic Passing of the Torch Ceremony from the Founding Governor of Palarotary. The Ceremonial Torch runner was RC Rivercity PE Joseph Ryan Lingua who handed the lighted torch to PDG Edi Chua C.K. who then passed the same to the PDGs next in line;
- 5) Tribute to the Fallen a stirring and heart-rending Tribute to the departed PDGs of RID 3800 was held by showing the pictures of ten (10) PDGs while the II Silenzio (taps) audio was being played. After which, the full Tribute text inside the circle of PDGs faces was read aloud;
- 6) Fireworks Display at about 7:30 pm, and after the Awarding Ceremonies, the Marikina skyline erupted with a spectacular three-minute plus fireworks display, never seen before in any Palarotary staging;
- Fellowship with two (2) live bands belting out dance music. Beers were shared while supply lasts; and
- 8) Palarotary Souvenir Program the first-ever Palarotary Souvenir Program will be issued late this month.

D3800 Golf Team successfully defended the Inter-District Golf Championship title with record-setting win by EMGA VIRGILIO "JUN" FARCON &

The D3800 Golf Team again emerged as the Inter-District Team Golf Champion in the recently concluded 9th Philippine Rotary Open Golf Tournament held in Davao City last February 9-10, 2023. This annual golfing event was sponsored by the Philippine Rotary Friendship and Golf Fellowship, Inc. (PRFGFI) and 8 District 3860 under the leadership of PDG Benjamin Garcia, in cooperation with the Rotary Club of Matina Davao for the benefit of the Philippine Rotary Media Foundation, Inc. (PRMFI). The annual golfing event was suspended during the pandemic for two years. The last one was held in February, 2020 hosted by D3780 and during that event, D3800 also emerged as the overall champion. This year's event was held in the prestigious South Pacific Golf Club for Day I and Ranchos Palos Verdes Golf Club for Day 2, both in Davao City.

DNC 2023 constituted, DGND bared

The District Nominating Committee (DNC) was constituted on 7 January 2023 by District Governor Arturo "Bobby" Tanyag. It was vested with the important task of screening and nominating the District Governor Nominee Designate (DGND) who will take the helm of the district in Rotary Year 2025-2026. The DNC was composed of twenty-seven (27) senior Rotarians who were nominated by their respective clubs after meeting certain criteria or qualifications, chaired by Immediate Past District Governor Augusto "Augie" Soliman.

Convened by Governor Bobby Tanyag, the DNC first met for an organizational assembly on January 14, 2023, 10 a.m. at the historic Club Filipino in San Juan City. They were given orientation on their roles and functions, including the Terms of Reference, by Past District Governor Anthony "Tonipi" Parungao. DNC officers were selected by the DNC members themselves. Series of meetings were held thereafter which culminated in the interview and secret balloting for the next District Governor for RY 2025-2026 on February 4, 2023, 3:30 p.m. at Club Filipino.

Subsequently, in a Memorandum addressed to the Imaginative Amazing Treasure Presidents (IATPs) dated February 21, 2023, Governor Tanyag declared that: "Following the provisions from our Terms of Reference and finding that no valid challenge was made by the Rotary Club during the prescribed period, I hereby formally declare PP GINA "GINA" T. SANCHEZ of the Rotary Club of San Juan, as the official winner of the recently concluded nominating process by the 2023 District Nominating Committee. Therefore, PP Gina "Gina" T. Sanchez will be the District Governor for Rotary Year 2025-2026 of Rotary International District 3800."








Club of Lakeshore Rizal

Anti-Rabies Vaccination Poject

Disease Prevention and Treatment is one of the Seven Areas of Focus of Rotary. Indeed, the Anti-Rabies Vaccination Project for the five Barangays in Talim islands of RC Binagonan is under this focus..

This project is dubbed as *Rabies ay Iwasan, Alaga'y Pabakunahan* which commenced even before the actual vaccination itself. IAT Pres. John went to the Talim Islands days before the actual vaccination to post tarps. An information dissemination that there will be an Anti-Rabies Vaccination for their pets was conducted. The Club also provided the Vaccination Cards made of paper board. No vaccination cards were left or thrown after as what usually happened before. All cards were kept by the pet owners as their record if not as souvenirs.

The Rotary Club of Binangonan partnered with the Municipal Agriculturist Office headed by OIC Erwin L. Diesto. The five Talim Islands Barangays served were Kinagatan, Kinaboogan, Bangad, Buhangin and Janosa.

Rabies remains a public health problem in the Philippines despite improvements in the availability of rabies vaccines and rabies immunoglobulin (RIG) as post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP). The incidence of rabies is highest in Metro Manila and surrounding areas. According to the World Health Organization, rabies can be prevented by vaccinating dogs which are responsible for 99 per cent of cases mainly through dog bites. Therefore, this Anti-Rabies Vaccination Project of the Rotary Club of Binangonan is not just timely but paramount in importance. The other I percent which is not from dog bites was covered by this project for there was a pet monkey which was vaccinated during the conduct of this project.

Senden Home Foundation, Inc. is a non-profit, non-government organization that delivers social and financial services under the Child Policy Law of the Department of Social Welfare and Development as it tenderly embraces homeless street children.

Rotary provides inspiration, education and support to some of the country's most under-served and underprivileged children. Sadly, it is so common to see children begging for food and sleeping on the streets. Providing them with access to education can not only provide safe spaces and security but also opportunities to move away from the streets and go on to lead a happy and healthy normal adult lives. Street Children are mostly product of physical or sexual abuse within the family. They often experience family problems, hunger, neglect and domestic violence. They escape from their homes and live on the streets.

Some of them were simply abandoned by their parents or relatives. Some also happened as a result of the demise of their parents. If not helped, street children often suffers from depression, anxiety, and trauma, which may lead to drug addiction or tendency to suicide.

In response to these needs, Rotary's compassionate care is actually helpful by: 1. Spending time with them; 2. Show them we CARE; 3. Instead of money, we give them food and clothing; 4. We eat together; 5. We volunteer; 6. We make them healthy; 7. We make them a part of the community; 8. We provide programs for their well-being; 9. We give temporary parental care; and 10. We teach them how to pray and be a good citizen.

Rotary programs or projects for the benefit of street children are: 1. Circumcision, 2. Feeding, 3. Leisure, 4. Clothing, 5. Sleeping beds, 6. Education, 7. Exercises, and physical activities, 8. Sports, 9. Communication, 10. Talent.







IAT D3800 Tree Planting Project – Our club led Rotary D3800 to action addressing climate change by protecting the environment for the generations to come.

In this project, a total of 2,323 trees were planted with 70 Clubs participating. Our Club wanted to make an impact in terms of protecting the environment that is why the club decided to elevate the project to the district level.

The activity likewise endeavors to sustain the unselfish service of RC Baras to keep the said river viable aquatic inhabitants while to promoting a clean and safe environment.










to provide school supplies to students in Pililla and even other towns, particularly those enrolled in Public Schools in any level.

When the COVID 19 pandemic occurred, most families suffered from loss of jobs, depleting their savings or having nothing left at all. And as the schools prepare for physical classes, how to be able to buy school supplies has been a serious concern to most families.

The Project conducted alongside the DepEd's Brigada Eskwela, where Pililla National High School became a partner thru a Fun Run, hence, the title of the project. Two Notebooks were asked from each participant for purposes of the registration. A total of 737 notebooks were gathered from the registration. Some donated cash to buy more school supplies and be used for other needs for the school, while some gave raffle prizes to liven up the event. Some government and civic organizations assisted during the whole race, making it a project well-participated by the community in 5 barangays. Furthermore, it has been an avenue to gain one new member - the Brigada Eskwela coordinator.

This Project has truly depicted the Filipino tradition of Bayanihan in a modern way, thus reflecting our very own Rotary Way.
