### RI PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

### **December 2022**



While sitting with a group of Rotary leaders outside of Lusaka, Zambia, I ask a question: "How many of you have ever had malaria?" Every hand in the room goes up. They even begin to tell me about the first, second, or third time they experienced the disease, one of the main causes of death and sickness in many developing countries.

They are fortunate. They have access to medical treatment and lifesaving medicines. For the people of rural Zambia, their story is very different.


On a wooden bench in a small village, I sit with Timothy and his young son Nathan. With a camera crew capturing our conversation, he tells me of the time Nathan showed signs of malaria. He brought the boy to the nearby home of a community health worker, where Nathan quickly received medicines that in all likelihood saved his life.

Calmly, Timothy tells me about his other son's bout with the disease a few years earlier. He had to race that son to a medical clinic more than 5 miles away. Riding a bike and carrying his child on his back, he tells me, he could feel his son's legs turn cold and then his little body go limp. As he finally entered the clinic, he screamed for help, but it was too late. The camera stops rolling, and we sit in silence. He begins to weep, and I hold him tightly. "I lost my son, I lost my son," he says.

This story is all too familiar for the families we meet over the next few days. And yet there is hope. Partners for a Malaria-Free Zambia is Rotary's first Programs of Scale grant recipient, and it is saving lives. Across two provinces of Zambia, 2,500 volunteer health workers have been selected by their communities. They are trained to bring medical care closer to those who need it, and they are able to diagnose and treat malaria and other ailments. Rotary partnerships create lasting change.



### RCSGP Hosted H.E.L.P. **Project**


The Rotary Club of Sampaguita Grace Park (RCSGP), hosted for District 3800, last November 24, 2022, the "Heal Earth, Live Peacefully" (HELP) project, a webinar on environment and climate change awareness.

The distinguished guests of the online event were Secretary Ma. Antonia Loyzaga of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), Executive Director Katherine Custodio of the World Wildlife Fund (WWF) Philippines, and Ms. Koleen Palaganas, Head of the SM Sustainability Office. A mixture of Rotarians. Rotaractors and students of the Paranaque National High School, totaling 213, attended the online event. RCSGP's very own Past President, Atty Lorna Kapunan, served as Moderator and Chairperson of the said event.



Secretary Loyzaga emphasized the need to work together to make large-scale, wide-ranging and systemic transformations to meet the target of limiting increase in warming temperature to 1.5 degrees Celsius. She stated that we must confront this climate emergency with a comprehensive risk management approach, and civic organizations such as the Rotary, and the private sector, have to step up as critical actors toward climate action.





On the other hand, Ms. Custodio spoke about climate change as a pressing challenge that we face as a global community. She shared that global average temperatures have already risen and are projected to further increase by 1.7 degrees to 4.8 degrees Celsius. This means that we will experience more extreme heat, heavy rainfall, drought, fire weather and ocean warming. In the Philippine context, she mentioned that we are ranked fourth in the Global Climate Risk Index as one of the most affected countries by extreme weather events such as sea level rising, more intense tropical cyclones, increased rainfall and compounded extreme events which lead to greater economic losses and fatalities. According to her, we are now in the end game and we must use this last decade to commit, act and advocate sustainability since we know that what we do during this time is what matters most and will define what the ending will be for all of us.

On her part, Ms. Palaganas shared that the present scenario shows that human activity is producing greenhouse gas emissions at a record high, with no

signs of slowing down. Thus, she stressed, that all of us need to contribute to curb this climate crisis. She presented SM's approach in doing its share in helping reach the finish line that we aim for to avoid irreversible damage to our ecosystems. Their mitigation and adaptation efforts are underway to shift to a low carbon economy and building resilience to climate change.

District Governor Bobby Tanyag responded by calling on Rotarians to do their parts as responsible citizens in reducing carbon footprints in our daily lives, and drawing up plans for future collaborations between District 3800 and WWF Youth Council to help heal the earth and live peacefully.




All heard, the common message is clear - climate change is a real and serious issue but there is still hope. Together, we can #Change the Ending.

Bai Rohanza Usman DG Ann Lorenzana PE Louie De Real





### **Brief Background on Zone 4B Rotary Clubs**

Like a whiskey, this club gets better with time. I am referring to the **Rotary Club of Marikina North** which has been in existence for forty-two (42) years and has produced one District Governor, in the person of Anthony "Tonipi" Parungao. The club has produced many past presidents who served as district officers of RI District 3800 with a current membership of forty-four (44) Rotarians plus five (5) newly inducted members. It has a giving of US\$7,000 which is over and above their US\$5,000 goal.

Next is the **Rotary Club of Marikina Heights** which has been in the service in the Marikina Heights area for twenty-three (23) years now. This club focuses on maternal and child care as well as basic education and literacy projects, among others. The very first Rotary Club in the town of San Mateo in Rizal Province is the Rotary Club of San Mateo which serves the community of San Mateo for almost sixteen (16) years now. It has produced past presidents who continuously serve as district officers. The club has twenty-six (26) members and has recently inducted three (3) new ones this current Rotary Year. The club also has a record breaking contribution to the TRF in the amount of US\$4,000. The current Senior Assistant Governor of Zone 4B, Past President Arthleen M. Fetalvero, hails from this club.

The sole Rotary Club in Rodriguez town in Rizal Province is the Rotary Club of Rodriguez which has 32 members at present. One of Rotary District 3800's goals and thrust is to encourage clubs in establishing scholarship funds to enable girls in pursuing higher education and to pave their way out of poverty. The district initiated the Empowering Girls campaign to encourage clubs to create more activities and projects that can enhance girls' education, safety, health, and well-being for them to transform their future.

The Rotary Club of Marikina North (RCMN) embraced this initiative by reaching out to World Vision Philippines and Force Saving Cooperative to partner with them. These are non-profit organizations which share the same goal as our district which is creating more opportunities for girls to succeed through education.

A signing ceremony was held on 29 November 2022 at the World Vision office in Quezon City. The RCMN, together with Force Savings Cooperative, will sponsor the education of 5 girls for 3 years through World Vision. This 3-year commitment has a total cost of Php135,000, payable in 3 equal installments to World Vision. RCMN and FSC will share the sponsorship cost for 5 girls equally. In addition, four members of the RCMN signed up to individually sponsor 5 more girls for 3 years. In total, RCMN will be sponsoring the education of 10 girls for at least 3 years with a total cost of Php270,000.

Signing the MOA were IATP Roland Cardinoza, RCMN Club President; Ms. Joanne Flores, Vice Chair of FSC; and Mr. Rommel Fuerte, WV National Director. Acting as a witness to the contract was Mr. Santos Godornes, Jr., the Director for Resource Development of WV. Also present in that event were IPP Jerome Mangubat, PP Mylene Valentino and Rtn Lemmie Landingin, all from the RCMN.

Today, the DREAM of relief for her son and herself in the form of a wheelchair will be made REAL and will make easier the task of caring for her helpless son and enable him to escape from the shackles of his prison bed from time to time.

Eleven other families, desperately in need for a wheelchair for a family member, and considering having one, just a dream (still); cannot believe that a REAL wheelchair will be delivered to them today!!!

Meanwhile, the members of the Emergency Response Team, witnesses to the tragic experience of trauma victims they tried to save, are DYING for lack of lifesaving rescue equipment. They have in their IMAGINATION, and practiced drill after drill of rescue missions using only imaginary Spine Boards.

But on November 10, 2022, at the Mayamot National High School grounds, the Rotary Club of Rivercity Marikina made these special people's (blind persons included) DREAMS AND IMAGINATION REAL.

President Dick dela Rosa headed the Rotary Club of Rivercity Marikina's turnover of the items to the beneficiaries. Other attendees were Rotarians Tony Sy, Esmer Tepace, Arnold Mendoza, Jonathan

### **6 AREAS OF FOCUS IN 1 DAY PROJECT**

Last August 14, 2022, the Rotary Club of San Mateo (RCSM), together with the Rotaract Club of San Mateo and the Interact Club of San Mateo National High School, in partnership with Barangay Malanday, Office of the Mayor of San Mateo and the AFP Reserve Command, joined hands to conduct a 6 Areas of Focus in 1 Day Project in Netra 2, Upper Patiis, San Mateo, Rizal.

Netra 2 is located in the upland part of San Mateo where quarrying is being done. The residents are mostly quarry workers and informal settlers. Help or assistance is hardly provided in that area as one has to pass through unpaved, muddy and sometimes flooded roads. Out of 1,000 residents in that community, more than 800 of them received various services in that project. The following are the details of this significant project:

Area of Focus # I: Fighting Disease — A free consultation for adult and children was conducted by volunteer doctors from the military. They also provided patients with prescribed medicines. Free tooth extraction was likewise conducted by our volunteer dentists. Eye check-up was also conducted with distribution of free reading glasses. Minor surgeries and circumcision were likewise conducted by the volunteer surgeons.

Area of Focus # 2: Saving Mothers and Children – Free medical consultations were done which benefitted mothers and children. Vitamins were also provided for free to mothers and children. Free snacks were provided to children. Hygiene Kits were distributed to the beneficiaries. A lecture on Women and Children Protection was also conducted with community leaders as participants.

Area of Focus # 3: Promoting Peace – The in-house lawyer of RCSM headed the "Magtanong Kay Attorney" Project in the same community on that same day. Together with other lawyers, they provided free legal counselling to ten (10) indigent residents in the community who have legal concerns or issues.

Area of Focus # 4: Providing Clean Water – The children were also gathered on that same day for an orientation on the proper hand washing and brushing of teeth. Free hygiene kits, which included soaps, face masks, toothbrush and toothpaste, were distributed to the attendees. Moreover, volunteer military personnel who



know how to cut hair provided free haircut to the children for their good grooming and hygiene.

Area of Focus # 5: Protecting the Environment – The club members of RCSM, upon learning of the newly constructed elementary school in that community, planted ornamental plants in the school grounds as part of the Green and Clean Environment Campaign. RCSM hopes that the same effort will be repeated by the teachers and students in the school premises in the coming days or years.

Area of Focus # 6: Growing Local Economy – All the projects conducted on that day also helped in the economic and community development of the Netra 2 community and its residents.

Moreover, in pursuit of the newest thrust of Rotary International on Empowering Girls, a **Lecture on Women and Children Protection** was conducted which highlighted the importance of **empowering our girls and women now** and in the future.

August 14, 2022 also marked our Rotary Day of Service as volunteers were invited by RCSM to become members. It was truly a day of service to our needy fellowmen in San Mateo.

### **PROJECT GINHAWA**

Project Ginhawa involves the restoration of roofs and the installation of lights and wall fans in four (4) classrooms at the Wawa National High School (WNHS) located in Barangay Wawa, Rodriguez (Montalban), Rizal. An estimated 150-200 pupils will benefit from the project.

It started when the school principal sent to the Rotary Club of Rodriguez (RCR) a letter requesting that the club do the repair and remodeling of their comfort rooms in compliance with existing government guidelines and regulations.

However, during the ocular visit and inspection conducted by RCR's Imaginative Amazing Treasure President / Engineer Estong Ocampo and his team, it was noted that their school classrooms have been nearly abandoned for almost 4 years now. The conditions were, as follows: I) with broken and leaky roofs; 2) with gloomy rooms such that students and teachers rely solely on sunshine to illuminate their classrooms; 3) there is no sufficient ventilation; and 4) there were not enough electrical outlets or power supply.




Hence, RCR came up instead with the project called "'Project Ginhawa" to repair and improve their classrooms in order to provide comfort and convenience to their students and teachers. The idea is for them to have conducive learning spaces where they can study and learn, with good roof, sufficient ventilation and lighting.

RCR will ensure that the facilities installed therein are properly maintained in collaboration with the Wawa National High School's teachers, parents, RCC Wawa Bubbles, and the students themselves. They are all responsible for monitoring and sustaining the facilities. RCR will also promote appropriate sitting and standing posture among students, as well as teach them how to avoid Covid-19 disease. We will also conduct other trainings for them. These matters are actually contained in the Memorandum of Understanding which RCR signed with the stakeholders in time for the turnover of the improved facilities last October 7, 2022.

### **RCSMH AIDED QUAKE, FLOOD VICTIMS:** CONDUCTED ROTARY DAY OF SERVICE. **GIFT-GIVING**

Heeding the call for help, the Rotary Club of San Mateo Highlands (RCSMH), led by IATP Ramil Palisoc and Spouse Wennie, distributed a total of 170 bags of rice to earthquake victims in Bangued, Abra, on August 6, 2022. It was meant to provide relief and comfort to earthquake victims as they try to recover from the wrath of a 7.0 magnitude earthquake that hit Luzon Island, with epicenter in Abra, last July 27, 2022. Dubbed as "Ahon Abra Relief Mission," the donations were directly given to the victims in coordination with the local government unit.

Moreover, when Typhoon Paeng subsequently hit Luzon Island late October 2022 causing massive flooding and destruction, RCSMH, led by IATP Ramil and Spouse Wennie, again responded to the call for help by distributing 100 sacks of rice to families of flood victims in various barangays in Lingayen, Pangasinan.

Moreover, on September 4, 2022, RCSMH conducted a Rotary Day of Service at the Multi-Purpose Hall of Our Lady of Banneaux, Barangay Silangan, San Mateo, Rizal. A total of 98 indigent families benefited from the project composed of children, mothers, men, elderly, LGBTQ, among others, who are residing in that depressed community. The project included free medical consultation, distribution of free medicines, vitamins, milk and other foodstuffs, free legal counselling, and mobile tutorial. Volunteer doctors, lawyers, teachers and Interactors joined the Highlanders in the conduct of the project. It was another high-impact project that touched many lives in which Highlanders were also able to invite prospective members from the volunteer professionals. The project was chaired by Charter President (CP) Prisco Rivera, Ir.

The traditional gift-giving project of RCSMH was conducted on December 16, 2022, at the Good Samaritan Nursing Home in Marikina City. The RCSMH, in partnership with VCD Clinic, donated food items (rice, milk, coffee, cereals, oats, biscuits, eggs, etc.) and hygiene stuffs (diapers, toiletries, etc.) for the benefit of 60 abandoned senior citizens. The club also sponsored a simple Christmas Party with a short program where PP

#### RCSMM'S VERY FIRST DISTRICT GRANT

The Rotary Club of San Mateo Midtown (RCSMM) was chartered on March 24, 2015 under then District Governor Marilou Co and then Membership Chair, Past President PP Gina Sanchez and DGSR Joerol Escaner with me as Charter President. Charter Presentation was held at the historic Manila Hotel on March 24, 2015.

After surmounting some birth pains and challenges, our club managed to stay alive. As Charter President, it is my duty, especially during challenging times, to guide our officers and members to continue our club activities and projects, participate in district and zonal projects and events, and enhance our fellowship, enjoyment and satisfaction in Rotary.

This current Rotary Year, we are happy to share that we're able to have our very first District Grant under my leadership as IATP. Actually, the first grant application was denied but due to strong recommendation of PP Gina Sanchez during our Governor's Visit, we were able have it eventually granted.

One of the projects I presented during our Governor's Visit under Fighting Disease is about the dental condition of a 25 years old lady with a 4-year mental age as she suffers from autism. Every time the pain strikes, she would grab and pull the hair of her mother. It was suggested during the Governor's Visit to look for a community, center or school which takes care of such patient.

Then, I visited the San Mateo Elementary School and had a meeting with the Principal and Class Coordinator. I found out that said elementary school has 173 students with autism with a light to moderate degrees of severity.





After series of communication with the Class Coordinator, we came up with our project entitled "Teeth O'clock Habit." The project includes dental lecture, proper nutrition, film viewing, storytelling and poster making contest. As much as I want to include toothbrush drill and application of fluoride varnish to all students, we would just pick those students who are manageable to handle. Of course, this project will always involve their parents. Dental lecture would cover from the very start of conception because everything that a pregnant mother does, anything she eats or drinks, everything on their habit, especially if oral cavity is involved, will be transmitted to the fetus inside their womb.

We had just finished the orientation on proper tooth brushing technique and distribution of 173 toothbrushes and toothpaste to students and 50 toothpaste to the parents who attended. With proper tooth brushing technique and the lectures given, RCSMM hopes that it would be a great help to eradicate tooth decay.

Our club is scheduled to come back after Christmas season to apply fluoride varnish on the clean surfaces of their teeth and for feeding as well. There will be another lecture and we will be judging as well their posters made in line with the project.

On the other hand, the one with moderate autism and suffering from too much pain every now and then had underwent a series of laboratory procedures, like chest xray, blood examination, and ECG. It was actually a challenge to bring her to the hospital. She was diagnosed to have leukemia and one week of antibiotic intake was prescribed by the doctor. After she will be put under sedation by a specialized dentist to do complete oral rehabilitation and treatment which took long because of the behavior of the patient, hopefully, the treatment can be done safely and successfully after the Christmas season.

This is the beauty of giving to The Rotary Foundation (TRF)! We receive because we give! So, I encourage all Rotarians to give.

This is the story of very first district grant which I am happy to share to everyone!

### RCPOM'S AV FISTULA CREATION **MEDICAL MISSION**

The Rotary Club Passport One Marikina (RCPOM) initiated the "AV Fistula Creation Medical Mission" to alleviate the suffering of the growing number of dialysis patients, the lack of surgeons capable of AV Fistula Creation and the increasing number of deaths of dialysis patients due to catheter infection and complications.



The project aims to save lives of patients suffering from Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD) and in need of immediate dialysis treatment. An AV Fistula Creation will cost a patient around sixty thousand pesos (Php 60,000) for hospital charges and professional fees. RCPOM covers these medical expenses aside from the Care Kit and food given to the patient and their companions during the Medical Mission. To date, there are more than a hundred indigent patients who benefited from the project conducted at the Taytay Doctors Hospital and Multispecialty Center in Taytay, Rizal, and at the Dr. Paulino I. Garcia Memorial Research and Medical Center in Cabanatuan, Nueva Ecija.

Currently, there are ongoing mini-AV Fistula Creation Medical missions every Wednesday at the Quirino Memorial Medical Center in Project 4, Quezon City. There will also be incoming AV Fistula Creation Medical Missions to be held at the Ospital ng Cabuyao

An arteriovenous (AV) Fistula is a surgically-created permanent access located under the skin that makes a direct connection between a vein and an artery. An AV Fistula is how patients are connected to a dialysis machine. Without AV fistula, patient cannot have dialysis and is at high risk of infection. Patients who stop dialysis may live a little over one week depending on their overall medical condition.







**WE SAVE LIVES.** With the AV Fistula Creation Medical Mission, the Rotary Club Passport One Marikina was able to save lives of indigent dialysis patients who cannot afford the high cost of operation. Without AV fistula, a patient cannot have dialysis and is at high risk of infection.
