Criteria and Guidelines



OBJECTIVE

Recognize members of the Rotary community within District 3800 for their dedication and valuable contributions which help make clubs stronger and communities better for Rotary Year 2023-2024.

We honor those that have excelled beyond the basic requirements and have *“shined above their peers”*.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for Major District recognitions and awards, Rotary club must be in good standing during Rotary Year 2023-2024 and must have complied with the following on or before **April 15, 2024**.

 - i. *Club Membership during Club Strategic Planning*
 - ii. *Assistant Governor / Senior Assistant Governor during Club Assembly prior to Governor's Visit*
 - iii. *District Governor during Governor's Visit*
- c. *No pending reports for submission re: District Grant and/or Global Grant projects*

MEMBERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

MAXIMUM OF 100 POINTS

- Membership retention rate on existing* members
 - At least 90.00% – **40 points**
 - Between 85.00% to 89.99% – **30 points**
- Net membership gain*
 - Five (5) or more new members – **25 points**
 - Three (3) to Four (4) new members – **20 points**
 - One (1) to Two (2) new members – **15 points**
- Net gain of at least one (1) new member is a female or under 40 years of age – **20 Points**
- 100% membership retention rate on new members for the Rotary year – **15 points**

**Notes:*

- *Base membership figure shall be the 1 July 2023 RI Membership Start Figures as extracted in Rotary Club Central*
- *Official count is based on members with Active membership status (Honorary members are excluded)*
- *Net membership gain criteria is deemed complied (25 points) if the Rotary club can sponsor by the cut-off either a new Rotary club (traditional), Satellite club, E-club, Passport club, or those that fall under the different Club Models as prescribed by Rotary International*

- Established a new or maintained an existing online presence (e.g., Website and/or Facebook page) – **15 points**
- Regular updates reflected on the online presence platform/s **same content posted in various platforms would be considered as one (1) post*

YOUTH SERVICE

MAXIMUM OF 100 POINTS

- ☐ Membership retention rate on existing members* of sponsored Rotaract clubs:
 - Rotary clubs with four (4) or more sponsored Rotaract clubs (Active status):
 - At least three (3) of the sponsored Clubs achieved at least a 90% membership retention rate – **70 points**
 - Rotary clubs with two (2) to three (3) sponsored Rotaract clubs (Active status):
 - At least two (2) of the sponsored Clubs achieved at least a 90% membership retention rate – **55 points**
 - Rotary clubs with one (1) sponsored Rotaract clubs (Active status):
 - Sponsored Club achieved at least a 90% membership retention rate – **40 points**

**Notes:*

- For existing Rotaract clubs, base membership figure shall be the 1 July 2023 RI Membership Start Figures as extracted in Rotary Club Central

YOUTH SERVICE

- Chartered and sponsored one (1) new Rotaract or Interact club or maintained sponsorship of an existing Rotaract or Interact club – **20 points**
- Sponsored RYLA participant(s) – **5 points per participant / max of 10 points (e.g., 2 participants or more)**



CLUB ADMINISTRATION

MAXIMUM OF 100 POINTS

- Must have held at least eighteen (18) regular club meetings – **20 points**
- Must have held at least two (2) club assemblies – **5 points**
- Must have had an average 60% regular home club meeting attendance percentage – **10 points**

- *100% Foundation Giving Club* – For clubs that achieve an average of \$100 in per capita giving and 100 percent participation, with every dues-paying member contributing at least \$25 to any or all of the following during the Rotary year: Annual Fund, PolioPlus Fund, approved global grants, or Endowment Fund.
- *Every Rotarian, Every Year Club* – For clubs that achieve a minimum Annual Fund contribution of \$100 per capita during the Rotary year, and every dues-paying member must personally contribute at least \$25 to the Annual Fund during the year.
- *Sustaining Member Club* – For clubs that achieve a minimum Annual Fund contribution of \$100 per capita during the Rotary year, and every dues-paying member must personally contribute at least \$100 to the Annual Fund during the year.
