# RI District 3800 Awards Criteria

Rotary Year 2024-2025



## Objective of the District Awards and Recognition Committee:

 To recognize RI District 3800 Rotary Clubs and Rotarians who achieved outstanding performance throughout the year.

The **Rotary Club Excellence Award** recognizes the hard work clubs do throughout the year. Taking action toward achieving the required number of goals helps clubs engage members, stay relevant in their communities, and run more efficiently. A welcoming and engaging club also reflects the values of Rotary. When clubs work to achieve these goals, they also contribute to the overall health and culture of Rotary for generations to come.

This year's Awards Committee will recognize clubs in 2 categories: Large Clubs - 36 members or more Small clubs - 20 to 35 members

## MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS to Qualify

To be eligible for the **District 3800 Club Excellence Award**, clubs need to:

- 1. Be active rotary clubs in good standing for at least 6 months on April 15, 2025;
- 2. Set at least half of the available goals in the Rotary Club Central by July 31, 2024;
- 3. Achieve charter strength by April 15, 2025
- 4. Submit Club Health Check, Member Satisfaction Survey and 3-Year Strategic Plan at least one week before the scheduled Governor's visit;
- 5. Be in good standing in District 3800 during the RY 2024-2025 by complying with the ff by April 15, 2025:

#### Fully paid with no arrears:

- a) RI dues (first and second semester invoices)
- b) District fund, Calamity fund and RICon Fund
- c) Subscription to the Philippine Rotary Magazine (PRM) or The Rotarian (Current dues fully paid with no arrears)
- d) Club listing fees for DISTAS 2024 and DISCON 2025
