Awards Committee

Objective of the District Awards and Recognition Committee:

- To recognize RI District 3800 Rotary Clubs and Rotarians who achieved outstanding performance throughout the year.

*The **Rotary Club Excellence Award** recognizes the hard work clubs do throughout the year. Taking action toward achieving the required number of goals helps clubs engage members, stay relevant in their communities, and run more efficiently. A welcoming and engaging club also reflects the values of Rotary. When clubs work to achieve these goals, they also contribute to the overall health and culture of Rotary for generations to come.*

This year's Awards Committee will recognize clubs in 2 categories:

Large Clubs - 36 members or more

Small clubs - 20 to 35 members

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS to Qualify

To be eligible for the **District 3800 Club Excellence Award**, clubs need to:

1. Be active rotary clubs in good standing for at least 6 months on April 15, 2025 ;
2. Set at least half of the available goals in the Rotary Club Central by July 31, 2024;
3. Achieve charter strength by April 15, 2025
4. Submit Club Health Check, Member Satisfaction Survey and 3-Year Strategic Plan at least one week before the scheduled Governor's visit;
5. Be in good standing in District 3800 during the RY 2024-2025 by complying with the ff by April 15, 2025:

Fully paid with no arrears:

- a) RI dues (first and second semester invoices)
- b) District fund, Calamity fund and RICON Fund
- c) Subscription to the Philippine Rotary Magazine (PRM) or The Rotarian (Current dues fully paid with no arrears)
- d) Club listing fees for DISTAS 2024 and DISCON 2025

CLUB EXCELLENCE AWARDS

- **Outstanding Clubs** - 80 to 90 points
- **Most Outstanding Clubs** - 91 to 100 points

AWARDS CRITERIA

Clubs will be judged based on the following criteria:

a) Club Administration	10%
b) The Rotary Foundation (TRF)	20%
c) Membership	20%
d) Service Projects	25%
e) Public Image	15%
f) New Generation & Partners in Service	<u>10%</u>
Total	100%

a) Club Administration (10%)

Must have been represented in the following district activities:

POINT SYSTEM PER CRITERIA

b) The Rotary Foundation (20%)

Factor	Points
1. Ranking based on club's absolute TRF contribution (Top 10 Clubs with highest contribution – 10 Next 10 clubs with highest contribution – 9 - diminishing points after every 10 clubs)	10 (highest)
2. Club donation of USD1500 to Polio Plus Fund	3 (highest)
Club donation \$1000 to \$1499 to Polio Plus Fund	2
Club donation of \$300 to \$999 to Polio Plus Fund	1
3. Achieved EREY Club status	3
4. Achieved 100% Foundation Giving Club status	2
5. Achieved Sustaining Member Club Status	<u>2</u>
Total Points	20

c) Membership and Partnerships (20%)

Must have achieved the following in membership:

1. Net growth of 5 members	8
2. Retention rate of 90% from July 1, 2024 members	6
3. Chartering new club models	3
4. At least 1 Rotaractor who became a Rotarian	2
5. At least 1 female new member or new below 40 yo	<u>1</u>
Total Points	20

POINT SYSTEM PER CRITERIA

d) Service Projects (25%)

The club must have implemented service projects in Rotary's Seven Areas of Focus, and should be posted in Rotary Showcase.

Clubs will be awarded points after presenting the following per project :

- *Number of Beneficiaries*
- *Community Needs Assessment*
- *Sustainability*
- *Monitoring & Evaluation*
- *Club and Rotary Service partners balanced participation (at least 50-50)*
- *Project funding sources*

CRITERIA

Presidents will be rated based on the points earned on the following criteria:

Factors	Points
a) Participated in 90% of District Activities (diminishing)	20
b) Individual TRF Contribution (10 pts per \$500.00, Maximum of 30 pts.)	30
b) Club Excellence Award Qualifier	<u>50</u>
Total Points	100

***Minimum requirement for Most Outstanding President: Club is
qualifier for Club Excellence Award.**

ASSISTANT GOVERNOR (AG) AWARDS

- Outstanding Assistant Governor
- Most Outstanding Assistant Governor

CRITERIA

AGs will be judged based on points earned on the following criteria:

Factors	Points
a) Attended 90% of District activities	20
b) Attended meetings of assigned clubs (At least one club per month)	20
c) Individual TRF Contribution (10 pts per \$500.00, Maximum of 30 pts.)	30
d) At least 1 Most Outstanding Club Qualifier	<u>30</u>
Total Points	100

SENIOR ASSISTANT GOVERNOR (SAG) AWARDS

- **Outstanding SAG**
- **Most Outstanding SAG**

CRITERIA

SAGs will be judged based on points earned on the following criteria:

Factors	Points
a) District Reports Submitted	20
b) Attended 90% of District activities	20
c) Individual TRF Contribution (10 pts per \$500.00, Maximum of 20 pts.)	30
c) At least 1 AG with Most Outstanding award <i>(Derived from the average points of his assigned AGs)</i>	<u>30</u>
Total Points	100
