## Rotary International President Message

With World Polio Day on 24 October, I'm proudly rooting for Rotary as we team up around the world to End Polio Now.

I had the honor of attending a Strike Out Polio event in July at PNC Park, home of the Pittsburgh Pirates MLB team. The Rotary Club of Delmont-Salem hosted the event, which raised \$1.3 million for PolioPlus.

Later in the summer, I joined members of our Rotary family in supporting the Más Millas Menos Polio (More Miles Less Polio) bike ride. Felipe Meza Chávez and his team rode all the way from Ciudad Juárez, Mexico, to One Rotary Center in Evanston, Illinois, to raise money and awareness. The ride took 12 days, and Felipe and his team collected more than \$100,000 to support the fight against polio. It was a joy to greet them as they arrived in Evanston.

And I was thrilled to see Team End Polio raise global awareness around the 2024 Paris Olympics. This world-class roster of athletes, global leaders, and polio eradication supporters came together to advocate for a world where no child has to live in fear of being paralyzed by polio. Some of the athletes on Team End Polio are polio survivors themselves, adding weight to their advocacy.

These are just a few examples of the many ways Rotary has teamed up recently to End Polio Now. It is vital that we continue to seek out and recruit teammates in polio eradication, especially after the challenges our eradication efforts have faced this year.

The Rotary world was heartbroken to learn about the tragic passing in August of Aidan O'Leary, director for polio eradication at the World Health Organization.

I knew Aidan and worked with him directly. He was a tireless advocate in the fight against polio and a kind, genuine man. We will remember him both for his advocacy and his warmth.

But where there is hardship, there is also hope. I feel hopeful whenever I consider the countless ways Rotary supports the fight every day to eradicate polio.

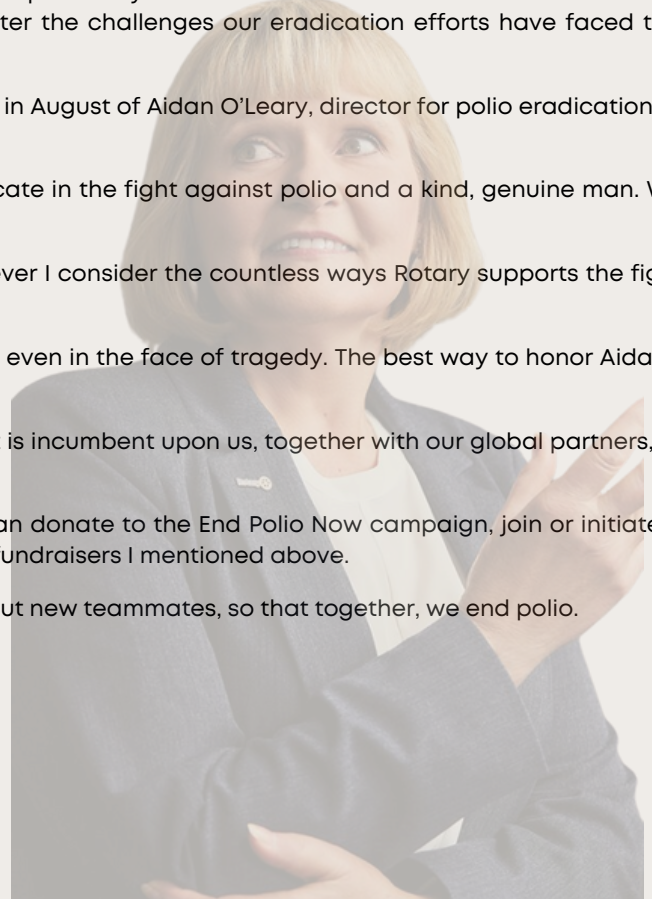

## Important Special Announcement from the District Secretary and District Governor

October 23, 2024

Memorandum: To All Irresistible Presidents and District Officers and Rotarians

Previously, in a Memorandum dated September 18, 2024 issued by the District Governor thru yours truly DS Dan Santos, we advised all the Rotary Clubs in our district that no decision has been issued yet by the RI Board and that as per advise of Mr. Andrew Best, we need to wait for the October Board Meeting where the election complaint of RC Marikina Hilltop will be acted upon.

In an email dated October 21, 2024 addressed to President Karl Marcus Montaner of RC Marikina Hilltop where DG Roberto Zamora was furnished by Mr. Andrew Best, we would like to report that the RI Board has decided on the election complaint of RC Marikina Hilltop which we are quoting below verbatim:

"Following the RI Board meeting of October 2024, please find below their decision regarding the club's election complaint.

### **B-9 Election Review Committee Report**

**DECISION:** The Board

4. receives the complaint of the Rotary Club of Marikina Hilltop (Philippines) concerning the election of the 2026-27 governor of District 3800 and based on the report of the Election Review Committee:

1. finds that the allegations of irregularities during the selection process are not substantiated by the documents submitted;
2. finds that the process used by the governor to validate the concurrences to the challenge submitted by the Rotary Club of Marikina Hilltop went beyond what is permitted by RI's rules and regulations;
3. upholds the complaint and directs the governor of District 3800 to proceed with the challenge submitted by the Rotary Club of Marikina Hilltop by conducting a club ballot between Rotarians Jerry Ang and Celso Montalla to elect the 2026-27 governor of District 3800.

*Note: Director Chew recused himself from the discussion and vote on point 4 above.*


Our office will work with District Governor Robert to conduct the club ballot (e-voting) in the coming weeks. The selected candidate will then attend the Zone GNLS and Institute in Taipei."

Under the RI Code of Policies, the decision of the RI Board is already final and is no longer subject to any appeal except with the Council on Legislation. In this regard, our District will implement the RI Board Decision immediately. We are just waiting for some clarifications on how to conduct the e-voting process. We will issue election guidelines to all the Clubs as soon as possible.


In the meantime, both candidates are advised to follow strictly the Latest D3800 Terms of Reference on E-Voting (Ballot by Mail) and are advised not to engage in any prohibited activities under the RI Code of Policies and D3800 Terms of Reference.

Since the challenge has been upheld by the RI Board, the decision of the DNC is set aside and the clubs will select the DGN for RY2026-27 by club vote. In the meantime, we will not have any DGN for RY 2026-27 until the e-voting process has been completed.

## District Secretary's Message

We are in the third month of the current Rotary Year and so busy with a number of activities and projects. To the Irresistible Rotarians of Rotary District 3800, let us continue working together to uphold the values of Rotary, and spread its magic in the communities we serve!

For this edition, let me share to you about the Rotary Citation. Starting 01 July 2024, it will be renamed as Club Excellence Award.

To be eligible for the Club Excellence Award, a club needs to be an active one in good standing or having paid each invoice balance in full upon receipt. To verify that a club is in good standing, go to My Rotary>Click on Club Name>Finance>Club Invoice. You should have an outstanding balance of \$0.00. Invoices are due when they are posted in mid-January and mid-July.

Also, Rotary club leaders can go into the Rotary Club Central and select the goals they wish to apply for the club excellence achievement. There is flexibility as the system allows clubs to choose the goals that are most relevant and achievable from their end. Moreover, many goals are self-reported by marking "achieved" in the Rotary Club Central. A club should achieve at least half of the goals by 30 June to be eligible for the Club Excellence Award.

Steps to achieve the Club Excellence Award:

1. Go to the Rotary Club Central;
2. Review the available goals;
3. Set at least half of the available goals;
4. Achieve these goals;
5. Report achievements in Rotary Club Central by 30 June; and
6. Pay club invoices in full upon receipt.

Once you are in the Rotary Club Central, go to Club Goals on the left side of the page if you are not there already, select the year, and click on the All tab to see the goals. Eligibility will be determined based on goals achievement as of 30 June.

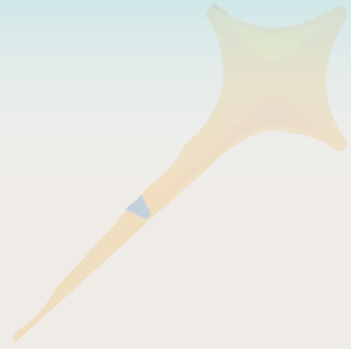
