### RD 3800 conducts "Sabayang Patak Kontra Polio" in Pasig City

On November 6, 2024, Rotarians from Rotary District (RD) 3800 came in droves to beat the morning rush and overwhelmingly expressed their unqualified support to the "End Polio Now" Campaign. The "Sabayang Patak Kontra Polio" featured about 100 babies aged 1 1/2 to 3 1/2 months from one of the country's most populous and 4th largest barangay - Barangay Pinagbuhatan, Pasig City - as beneficiaries of this premier Rotary service project.

The quintessential leader known for her brand of excellence in Rotary service, the End Polio Now Zone 10A Coordinator and Past District Governor Marilou Co, left no stone unturned and entrusted this project to the high performing Rotary Club of Mutya ng Pasig, who prepared a short but meaningful program that delighted those in attendance. They were welcomed by a festive group of young members of the community who showed their approval for the project aimed at eradicating and completely ending the spread of polio in their community.

Irresistible District Governor Roberto "Bobby" Zamora led the "Sabayang Patak Kontra Polio," assisted by EPNC PDG Marilou Co, PDG Tony Co, DGE Gina Sanchez, PDGL Vicky Solis, Irresistible District officers, Irresistible Presidents, and Rotarians from 74 clubs in RD 3800.

Just before the immunization, each infant beneficiary passed through a thorough medical check up to ensure their readiness to receive the polio vaccine. Aside from giving them Polio vaccine, beneficiaries were also given loot bags filled with toiletries like toothpaste, toothbrush, soap, tissue wipes, baby bottles and clothes, including biscuits, and chocolates.

The Rotarians themselves went home happy and fulfilled after doing good for humankind, made more special with a buffet breakfast courtesy of the host club. They also received a commemorative mug and a cute polio bear as tokens. Some were even fortunate enough to win prizes in the surprise raffle draw.

To cap the event, three dozen of doves were released simultaneously by the district's Irresistible Team and End Polio advocates, symbolizing a promise of a brighter tomorrow and a new beginning for a world free from the menace of the dreaded polio disease.

In the same breath, DG Bobby also provided clarification on the upcoming voting of Rotary Clubs in the district as mandated by Rotary International. Said election is between Past President (PP) Jerry Ang of RC Valenzuela Sunrise and PP Celso Montalla of RC Marikina Hilltop who are vying for the position of District Governor-Nominee for RY 2026-2027. DG Zamora distributed the bio-data of both candidates in line with the Amended Terms of Reference, giving clubs the opportunity to review their credentials to have an informed decision. DG Zamora also sought the Irresistible Presidents' understanding as they await the release of the official club voting guidelines, which are set to be issued by Rotary International.

Montalla explained how the incentive scheme, which rewards early remitting clubs with special prizes, helped increase participation and funding for the district's projects; and
- · Vocation Committee Chair CP Hermie Cariño spoke about the most recent projects under the Committee, particularly focusing on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) initiatives that will take center stage in the coming months.
